



## KIRYAT ONO SCOUTS GO GERMANY




Together with our kids we have developed a programme that we hope will give you an impression of what we German scouts do and how we live in western Germany.

Let's first have a look on where we live...

The first city we want to introduce to you is Dormagen (1), the red coloured. This is where our adventure is going to start and where our campsite is. You will spend your first night in the families of our kids after we all got to know each other a little.

The next day we will spend in Cologne (3) and sleep over in Bonn (4) (the former capital of Germany)(05.08.). Before we continue our trip to Rhens, you will visit the House of German History in Bonn and learn about our country (06.08.).

In Rhens (5) we will start our hike for around three days and end up with it in Alf (6) where a lot of activities such as climbing and canoeing are possible during our three day stay there (06.-11.08).

On 12.08. we will go back to Dormagen and you will finally see our beautiful campsite at the river Rhine. The day after our arrival we will go to an amusement park that is located close to Cologne in Bruehl (7). You will also see the city of Dormagen itself, you will meet our major there and we will show you around. As all this fun has to be organised and paid here you have more information on the costs etc.:

From you we expect a number of 15 scouts plus one adult leader to visit us from August 2<sup>nd</sup> until August 17<sup>th</sup>.

For your flight there will be a refund organised which will cover an amount of 280€ maximum per person. The camp itself will cost 350€ but fortunately we can expect refunds here as well. These refunds will lower your own contribution significantly (eventually up to over 60%)!! Still we want to invite your leader to stay here for free. The information and details about the entire costs still is dependent on the amount of grants that we will receive.
